OVERVIEW

The Home Department, Government of Sindh, is a key administrative body responsible for maintaining law and order, ensuring public safety, and overseeing various security and civil defense matters across the province. Under the leadership Minister for Home Mr. Zia Hassan Lanjar, along with the Minister for Prisons Mr. Ali Hassan Zardari, the department has been actively expanding its services to improve governance, strengthen security measures, and enhance public outreach programs.

CORE FUNCTIONS AND RESPONSIBILITIES

1. The Home Department plays a vital role in various sectors, including:
 - I. Law & Order and Security.
 - II. Coordination with police forces, Rangers, and intelligence agencies to combat crime and terrorism.
 - III. Counterterrorism operations and intelligence-based actions against extremist groups.
 - IV. Strengthening urban security by managing law enforcement in high-risk areas.
 - V. Ensure peaceful environment and strengthening economic activities in rural areas, effective. Kacha-operations have been launched and busted many gangs of dacoits and their rings particularly at the upper part of Sindh.
 - VI. Implementation of smart surveillance systems to monitor crime hotspots.
 - VII. Overseeing the management and security of jails and detention centers.
 - VIII. Ensuring proper classification and segregation of prisoners based on security risk and legal status.
 - IX. Preventing prison escapes, riots, and security breaches.
 - X. Ensuring humane treatment of inmates as per national and international human rights standards.
 - XI. Monitoring jail conditions to prevent overcrowding and inhumane conditions.
 - XII. Managing and overseeing parole and probation policies.
 - XIII. Formulating policies for modernizing prison management and rehabilitation programs.
 - XIV. Assisting released prisoners in reintegration into society through employment and support programs.
 - XV. Identifying prisoners eligible for release after serving a major portion of their sentence through coordinating with philanthropic organizations, welfare bodies, and government funds to arrange Diyat (blood money), Arsh (compensation for injury), and Daman (compensation for damages) for indigent prisoners.
 - XVI. Ensuring a transparent mechanism for the collection and disbursement of these funds.
 - XVII. Issue operative licenses to private companies and their strict monitoring and security audit

Prisons & Rehabilitation:

- I. Oversight of Sindh's prison system, ensuring humane treatment of inmates.
- II. Reforms for prisoner rehabilitation and reintegration programs.
- III. Upgrading prison facilities for better security and living conditions.
- IV. Providing legal aid and fair treatment to under trial prisoners.

Public Service Expansion & Social Welfare:

- I. Outreach programs for disabled persons, ensuring accessibility to government services.
- II. Expansion of public grievance redressal mechanisms to address citizens' complaints.
- III. Coordination with NGOs and welfare organizations to support vulnerable communities.

Counterterrorism and Foreign Threat Management:

- I. Working with Sindh Counter-Terrorism Department (CTD) and intelligence agencies.
- II. Strengthening border and coastal security to prevent foreign terrorist infiltration.
- III. Implementation of anti-radicalization initiatives to curb extremism.

Urban and Rural Security Control:

- I. Deployment of special task forces in crime-prone urban areas.
- II. Strengthening rural policing to prevent feudal conflicts and organized crime.
- III. Coordination with local administrations for disaster management and emergency response.

Sindh Forensic Science Agency & Investigation Enhancements:

- I. Development of advanced forensic labs for better crime investigation.
- II. Training law enforcement officers in modern forensic techniques.
- III. Implementation of Sindh Forensic Science Agency Act, 2019, with continuous refinements.

Implementation of Karachi Safe City & Sindh Safe City Surveillance:

- I. Installing high-tech CCTV cameras with AI-based facial and vehicle recognition across key locations for real-time monitoring of criminal activities.
- II. Integrated Command & Control Centers: Establishing centralized monitoring hubs to coordinate with law enforcement agencies for quick response to security threats.
- III. Smart Policing & Predictive Analytics: Utilizing data analytics, AI, and geo-mapping to predict crime patterns and enhance proactive policing strategies.

Regulation & Monitoring of Private Security Companies

- I. Ensuring that private security companies are registered, licensed, and compliant with government regulations.
- II. Training & Standards: Monitoring that security guards receive proper training, background verification, and adhere to standardized protocols for safeguarding private firms, installations, businesses, and properties.
- III. Conducting regular inspections and audits of private security firms to ensure they meet legal and operational standards.

- I. Smart city surveillance through CCTV expansion and AI-based monitoring.
- II. Digitization of police records and complaint registration

- II. Comprehensive Training & Skill Development – Mandating advanced training programs for security guards, including firearms handling, crisis response, digital surveillance, and emergency protocols to meet evolving security threats.
- III. Strict Regulation of Weapons & Ammunition – Implementing secure storage, tracking, and usage policies for firearms and ammunition to prevent misuse, theft, or illegal trade.

Challenges and the Way Forward

Despite notable progress, the department faces several challenges:

- I. Rising urban crime rates and the need for better community policing.
- II. Prison overcrowding and the need for alternative sentencing programs.
- III. Cross-border and cyber threats requiring advanced intelligence capabilities.
- IV. Budgetary constraints impacting security and welfare initiatives.

To address these, the department plans to:

- ✓ Enhance technological integration in policing and intelligence.
- ✓ Expand rehabilitation programs for both prisoners and at-risk youth.
- ✓ Improve coordination with federal and international security agencies.
- ✓ Strengthen legal frameworks for crime prevention and counterterrorism.

SINDH FORENSIC SCIENCE AGENCY

Project Background:

- I. The Provincial Apex Committee during its meeting on Law & Order in 2013 recognized the weaknesses in existing prosecution services system due to lack of forensic lab facilities in Sindh Province and envisaged to the revamp criminal prosecution service by establishing state-of-art forensic lab under the directions of Supreme Court of Pakistan and decided the “Establishment of Sindh Forensic Science Agency with state-of-the-art Sindh Forensic Science Laboratory (SFSL) at Karachi”.
- II. Project progress is being reviewed by Honourable Judges of Supreme Court / Monitoring Judge, Anti-Terrorism Court for the Province of Sindh, in pursuance of the guidelines issued by the Honorable Supreme Court of Pakistan in the case of Sh. Liaquat Hussain (PLD 1999 SC-504) for monitoring of Anti-Terrorism cases.

Project Features:

- I. 30 Acres of state land (free of cost) allotted by Sindh Government for establishing Sindh Forensic Science Laboratory at DehJoreji, Bin Qasim Town, off link road N5 Eastern Bye Pass, District Malir, Karachi.
- II. **Project PC I approved in 2016** (Rs 2.6 billion) but project didn't kick off and showed no progress at site (for next 6 years) as major basic components were not covered.
- III. Govt of Sindh legislated FSA Act in August **2017** “The [Sindh Forensic Science Agency Act 2017](#)”.
- IV. Project Consultant is M/s [NESPAK](#) for design, construction and supervision (**2021**).
- V. M/s NESPAK developed project [Master Plan: 20 Acre](#) land designated for Forensic Science laboratory & its allied facilities. **10 Acre** land kept Residential Complex for SFSA staff.
- VI. **March 2024** - Project Re-revised PC-I ([Rs 8.023 B](#)) was approved.
- VII. Revised PC-I (3rd Revision) PC-I ([Rs9.228 B](#)) is submitted in P&D Dept for approval.
- VIII. Construction of Residential Block Phase-I PC-I amounting ([Rs541 M](#)) was approved in May-2024 and work in progress.

PROPOSED DRAFT LAWS, REGULATORY & FINANCIAL REFORMS UNDER CONSIDERATION

<p style="text-align: center;">Several draft laws and regulatory reforms are in various stages of finalization, review, or development, aiming to enhance security, law enforcement, and compensation structures. Key points include:</p>	
Change in CPLC Chairmanship	Proposal to shift the CPLC Chairman’s appointment of Executive Council from a High Court/Supreme Court Judge to the Home Minister for better administrative oversight. The CPLC Rules have been amended and now Minister for Home Sindh has become the Chairman of the CPLC Executive Council.
Shaheed Compensation Enhancement	The compensation for martyrs (Shaheed personnel) has been significantly increased from Rs. 10 million to 23 million with salary till the age of retirement and two jobs for the family members, ensuring better support for their families.
Procurement of Bulletproof Vehicles	3. A strategic plan is being developed, along with securing financial resources, to procure bulletproof vehicles for both CPEC and non-CPEC security operations.
Sindh Police Rules, 2025	A comprehensive review and drafting of updated Police Rules is underway to modernize law enforcement practices and accountability mechanisms.
Private Security Companies Act, 2025	A new regulatory framework is under consideration to enhance licensing, operational standards, and audits for private security companies.
Habitual Offenders Rules, 2025	A draft rules are under process to define legal mechanisms for monitoring and rehabilitating repeat offenders.
Parole & Probation Act, 2025 And Rules, 2025	A new Parole and Probation Act is in progress to establish clear guidelines for early release, supervision, and rehabilitation of convicts.

E-COURTS FACILITIES IN PRISONS

Achievements

The Sindh Prisons & Corrections Service (SP&CS) has successfully established e-court facilities in all prisons of Sindh under Rule 670 of the Sindh Act. / Rules 2019, Making a significant step towards judicial efficiency and security.

Impact of Steps Taken

- I. Faster Trails:** Virtual hearings reduce delays, ensuring swift case proceedings and minimizing case backlogs.
- II. Time & Cost Savings:** Eliminates prisoner transportation expenses and reduces the workload of law enforcement agencies.
- III. Enhanced Security:** Prevents risks associated with transporting prisoners, ensuring their safety and public security.
- IV. Decongested Court Premises:** Limits unnecessary movement of prisoners, improving court room management

ROBUST COMPLAINT REDRESSAL MECHANISM

A robust complaint redressal mechanism is established at the inspectorate level in prisons to ensure to redress grievances of complainants. This mechanism serves as a structured approach for individuals to submit their complaints and for authorities to respond systematically.

- iv. **Improved Prison Administration:** Identifying and addressing systemic issues leads to better governance, resource allocation, and overall management of correctional facilities.

ONLINE VISITATION SCHEDULING FOR HASSLE FREE INTERVIEW PROCESS FOR FAMILIES \ ADVOCATES OF INMATES

Achievement

The introduction of the Online Visitation Scheduling System for inmates' families and Advocates at Central Prison Karachi marks a significant achievement of SP&CF toward improving prison management and enhancing the visitor experience. This system aims to streamline the process by allowing visitors to book their visitation slots online, ensuring a smoother, more organized experience for both the visitors and the prison staff. With the success of this initiative at Central Prison Karachi, the Sindh Prisons & CS (SP&CS) plans to extend this system to other prisons across the province. The online scheduling will contribute to a hassle free interview process and improve overall operational efficiency.

Impact of Steps Taken

- i. **Improved Efficiency and Reduced Waiting Times:** Visitors will no longer need to wait in long queues, as the system will allocate time slots, minimizing congestion and improving the overall efficiency of the visitation process.
- ii. **Enhanced Security and Control:** The system will help the prison authorities maintain better control over the number of visitors at any given time, which will enhance security and ensure compliance with safety protocols.
- iii. **Better Planning and Resource Management:** With advance scheduling, the prison staff can better plan resources, such as security personnel and interview areas, ensuring smoother operations and reducing the chances of any disruptions during visitation hours

MOU WITH STEVTA AND FAST NUCES KARACHI

- i. **Improved Employability:** Through the vocational training programs under the STEVTA MoU, inmates and staff will gain marketable skills that enhance their career prospects and financial independence.
- ii. **Enhanced Research Capabilities:** The partnership with the National University will boost the institution's research potential, providing new avenues for innovation and addressing challenges through academic insights.
- iii. **Socio-Economic Reintegration:** Skills development for inmates will play a key role in their successful reintegration into society, reducing recidivism and contributing to their social and economic upliftment.
- iv. **Capacity Building of Institutions:** The MoUs will help strengthen the educational and vocational training infrastructures of involved institutions, fostering growth and sustainability.

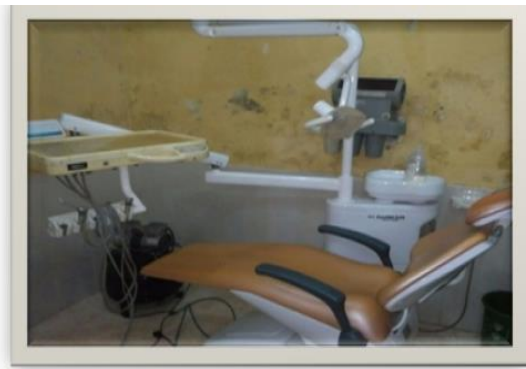
HEALTH CARE FACILITIES
